Joys and Hard Aches of Life

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. A time to weep, and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance. Ecclesiastes 3:1, 4

On Monday we celebrated our country's 246th birthday. It was on July 4, 1776 that the Declaration of Independence was ratified by the Second Continental Congress which established the United States of America. I am thankful to be an American and live in the USA. We certainly have our share of challenges and disagreements, but I sure appreciate the freedoms we have to worship along with so many other benefits we enjoy in America.
